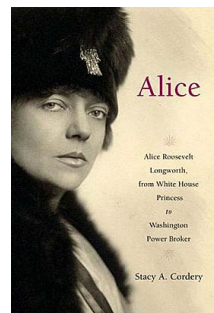

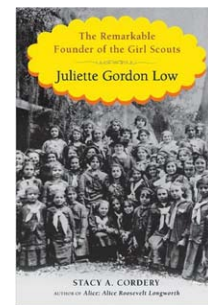

First Lady FAQ'S

Did you know that?



Louisa Catherine Adams
1775 - 1852

Louisa Catherine Adams was the nation's only foreign born first lady. She was the wife of our sixth president, John Quincy Adams.

Born Louisa Catherine Johnson in London on Feb. 12, 1775, she met John Quincy Adams when she was 19. He was U.S. ambassador to the Netherlands at the time.

She became a popular hostess in Washington in the 1830s and 1840s, when John Quincy was elected to Congress after an 1825-1829 term as president.

She suffered a stroke in 1849 and died in 1852. She is entombed at Quincy's United First Parish Unitarian Church, in the same basement crypt with her husband and her in-laws, John and Abigail Adams. Congress honored her when she died by having both the House
